The purpose of this Newsletter is to provide stakeholders with an update on the Julia Creek Project.

QEM Limited (QEM) is an ASX-listed company developing the Project, located in one of the world's richest critical minerals regions, 16 kilometres (km) south-east of Julia Creek in the McKinlay Shire, North West Queensland.

The Project holds a globally significant vanadium resource and significant hydrocarbon resources, and it will deliver and utilise innovative and sustainable energy solutions.

QEM was pleased to join AMEC (Association of Mining and Exploration Companies) and Australia's junior miners in a campaign for stronger government support for the country's critical minerals sector, pushing the Australian Government to introduce a Critical Minerals Production Tax Incentive for all 31 critical minerals at a value of \$7.0 billion over 11 years from 2023-24!

Thanks to the Federal Minister for Resources Madeleine King who was a very vocal proponent for this important measure for the emerging vanadium industry.

Circular Economy Project



QEM is working with the School of Chemical Engineering at UQ to turn trash to treasure - extracting high value, ultra high purity V2O5 (vanadium required for long duration energy storage) from spent catalyst acquired from Incitec Pivot and Sun Metals sulphuric acid plants, material which would otherwise go to landfill as waste. In April, QEM was delighted to lead a delegation from government, academia and AMEC (Association of Mining and Exploration Companies) to UQ for a 'show and tell' regarding QEM and UQ's collaboration to date.

QEM was delighted to be invited to Curtin University to celebrate the achievements of the Resources Technology and Critical Minerals Trailblazer Program, as an industry partner to The University of Queensland School of Chemical Engineering UQ (UQ).

On behalf of QEM and UQ, Jo Bergamin and UQ's project lead, Associate Prof. James Vaughan had the opportunity to discuss with Senator the Hon. Anthony Chisholm, Assistant Minister for Education and Assistant Minister for Regional Development, the successfully demonstrated technical feasibility of upcycling Queensland waste material to recover high purity vanadium pentoxide, as well as the ongoing scope for the UQ-QEM partnership under the Trailblazer program, not to mention the potential for the Federal or Queensland Government to partner with UQ and QEM and play a key role in accelerating from pilot to commercial scale production of Queensland industrial waste to high purity vanadium for battery electrolyte to begin to meet Queensland's and indeed Australia's vast renewable energy storage needs!
